



SANTA FE GLASS SINKS

CARE & MAINTENANCE TIPS



Cleaning Guide

Santa Fe Glass sinks are beautiful and durable sinks that are easy to clean and maintain. They can be enjoyed indefinitely with a little bit of regular care and maintenance.

The following types of cleaners should never be used:

- Coarse cleaners with grit (Ajax)
- Acidic chemicals

Keep abrasive cleaning pads away from your Santa Fe Glass sink, including:

- Steel Wool
- Brillo Pads
- Pumice Products
- Wire Brushes

In order to prolong the life of your Santa Fe Glass sink, simple daily maintenance is the key to keep your sink in its original condition. Clean your sink after each use with a soapy sponge, then rinse thoroughly with warm water. You may dry it with a towel or a dry cloth. This will eliminate water spots and streaks, while the sink is in use.

Abrasive bathroom cleaners like Ajax will scour and dull the glass, causing it to lose lustre and shine. Avoid using these types of abrasives.

Some of the Santa Fe Glass sinks are hand painted on the bottom side of the sink and caution needs to be taken when performing regular care and maintenance. Use only mild dish soap and water to clean these areas.

Stains

You may begin to notice stains on your glass sink, but don't be alarmed as they are most often caused by minerals within your water supply. These mineral deposits are known for causing stains by settling on the surface of the glass.

Elimination of these stain spots are simple by using a nonabrasive cleaner such as soft-scrub. It's important not to apply force while cleaning your glass sink, so that you prevent any undo stress on the glass which can lead to chipping and cracking in the future. Do not forcefully scrub the stain, as you may scour the glass to an irreparable state.

When finished with applying your mild abrasive, rinse thoroughly with warm water and dry the sink with a soft cloth.

Addressing Chips or Cracked Sinks

Although not common, Santa Fe Glass sinks, like any glass, can be susceptible to chips and cracks due to temperature change in water and heavy objects being dropped within the vessel. If a Santa Fe Glass sink is chipped or cracked, it generally cannot be glued back together, and can further induce shattering or larger cracking when variations in temperature exist.

Preventing Chips and Cracks

It is very easy to prevent chips and cracks from forming in your Santa Fe Glass sinks. A key rule of thumb is that if the water going into the vessel is too hot to touch, then it is too hot to be in your glass sink. Extremely hot water and quick temperature changes can cause your sink to chip, crack, or in some instances shatter.

Remember that Santa Fe Glass sinks are hand crafted from the highest quality tempered glass, and are extremely durable and resistant to corrosion. However, despite the durability and strength of our sinks, they may still be damaged if proper measures are not taken in their care and maintenance.
