### CARE & MAINTENANCE TIPS

#### Cleaning Guide

Vision vanity sinks feature an integral overflow with decorative fitting, and a flat, easy-mount rim that is chamfered in the rear for easy faucet installation. Vision sinks are extremely easy to clean and maintain. They can be enjoyed indefinitely with a little bit of regular care and maintenance.

#### The following types of cleaners should never be used:

- Coarse cleaners with grit (Ajax)
- Acidic chemicals
- Alcohol based cleaners

#### Keep abrasive cleaning pads away from your Vision sink, including:

- Steel Wool
- Brillo Pads
- Pumice Products
- Wire Brushes

Do not place hot objects in the sink. Wait until they have cooled before placing them in the sink to avoid scorching the surface. Do not pour hot grease or wax into the sink.

#### Cleaning Guide

Our recommendation for cleaning your Vision sink is a 3M Scotch-Brite® pad and Comet®, Ajax® or any other powder detergent. Please be careful with drain cleaners. Make sure that the cleaning agent goes down the waste outlet and that it does not sit in the basin. You may clean your sink periodically with a diluted bleach solution.

#### Scratch Removal

Scratches and small chips from sharp utensils may occur over time through use but they can easily be removed by sanding with a 3M Scotch-Brite® pad for fine scratches, and sandpaper for deeper scratches and small chips. Use a coarse sandpaper (100 or 150 grit) to start, finishing off with fine sandpaper and a 3M Scotch-Brite® pad.

#### Removing Tough Stains

To remove tough stains from your Vision sink, fill your basin up with warm water and add a cap full of bleach. Let this bleach

water solution sit in the sink for 3-5 minutes. While the sink is soaking, use a soft sponge dipped in the solution to scrub away any tough stains that may be visible. Drain the bleach solution when the elapsed time has passed and rinse the sink out with plain water. Dry the sink with a towel or soft cloth.

The beauty of solid surface is that it's renewable, which means some routine polishing will keep your sink looking just like the day you bought it.
